# **SCRIPTURE READING**

# Colossians 3:1-17 (NIV)

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God.

- <sup>2</sup> Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.
- <sup>3</sup> For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God.
- <sup>4</sup> When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.
- <sup>5</sup> Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry.
- <sup>6</sup> Because of these, the wrath of God is coming.
- <sup>7</sup> You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived.
- <sup>8</sup> But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips.
- <sup>9</sup> Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices
- <sup>10</sup> and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator.
- <sup>11</sup> Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all.
- <sup>12</sup> Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.
- <sup>13</sup> Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.
- <sup>14</sup> And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

- <sup>15</sup> Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful.
- <sup>16</sup> Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts.
- <sup>17</sup> And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

# **GOSPEL READING**

# John 15:1-17 (NIV)

- "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.
- <sup>2</sup> He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.
- <sup>3</sup> You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.
- <sup>4</sup> Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.
- <sup>5</sup> "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.
- <sup>6</sup> If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.
- <sup>7</sup> If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.
- <sup>8</sup> This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.
- <sup>9</sup> "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love.
- <sup>10</sup> If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love.
- <sup>11</sup> I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.
- <sup>12</sup> My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.
- <sup>13</sup> Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.
- <sup>14</sup> You are my friends if you do what I command.

- <sup>15</sup> I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.
- <sup>16</sup> You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.
- <sup>17</sup> This is my command: Love each other.
