Dear UMCSO Family,

We have had a lot of rain this year. But rain is so important. I am so grateful for our rain. I remember a few year**s** ago when I lived it Connecticut we were under drought conditions. For a brief time we could not water our lawns or wash our cars outside. Now https://www.drought.gov/ exists so we can monitor droughts in all 50 states. We need water to survive. Local farmers may get a bit anxious as they plant their crops, knowing there is a need for water.

At times there are "seasons" in our spiritual lives where we feel dry; perhaps it is because of a personal situation. But God calls us to trust in him in all situations. Jeremiah 17:7-8 says:

Blessed are those who trust in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD.

8 They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream.

It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit

For John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, seeking to live a life of holiness, a life devoted to God, was of vital importance. If you look at his journals you will find that the seriousness of his spiritual discipline extended all year long; he strived for holiness on a daily basis. However, John Wesley struggled with many a season of drought before fully embracing the power of God.

John Wesley and his brother were leaders of the evangelical revival in the Church of England in the eighteenth century. They both attended Oxford and there they gathered a few friends with whom they practiced a strict adherence to the worship and discipline of the Book of Common Prayer. From this strict observance is how they received the nickname, "Methodists." Along with two fellow students, they formed a small club, for the purpose of study and the pursuit of a devout Christian life.

Having been ordained as Anglican priests, the brothers went to the American colony of Georgia in 1735, John as a missionary and Charles as secretary to Governor Oglethorpe. They found the experience disheartening, and returned home in a few years. On the way, John's ship encountered a terrible storm. What caught Wesley's attention was that, while the English on board were screaming for fear of their lives, the German Moravians sang songs. Wesley asked one of them "Weren't you afraid? Weren't your women and children afraid?" The man said, "Thank the Lord, we were not afraid; we are not afraid to die."

Later, Wesley met with one of the German pastors for advice. The pastor asked him, "Do you have the witness within? Does the Spirit of God bear witness with your spirit that you are a child of God?" Wesley was caught off guard (not something that happened very often). And so the pastor asked, "Do you know Jesus Christ?" Wesley said, "I know he is the Savior of the world." The pastor replied, "That's true, but do you know he has saved you?" Wesley said, "I hope he has died to save me." "But do you KNOW?" And then comes those powerful lines from John Wesley, "I said, 'I do.' But I fear they were vain words as he continued to struggle with his faith.

However, what was to happen to Wesley on May 24, 1738 would forever change his life and the world we now know. He wrote the following in his journal: "In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's Preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation, and an assurance was given to me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Wesley's Aldersgate experience is identified as a turning point in his spiritual growth. He moved from a spiritual dry season to the true beginning of revival in his heart that he would share with others.

Has your heart been strangely warmed? May the Holy Spirit touch each one of us so that we can follow with faith. I pray that Wesley will be our inspiration as we grow in our faith and Holiness and put God first as we go out in mission to the world to feed the sick and help those in need.

May the Lord touch each of us and give us such passion, joy and devotion that we may share the Good News of hope with others. And, when we have yet another rainy day, may we thank God for the blessings and growth that comes because of it.





Why Attend Vacation Bible School?



VBS stands for Vacation Bible School, and it is a summer church outreach focused on giving kids a fun and creative place to learn about the Bible and to build relationships with other kids and churches in the area. VBS offers the church fun and creative methods of teaching kids and youth Christlike values and relationship-building skills. It is an excellent outreach tool into the


