- ¹⁸ Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

- ²¹ Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence before God;

John 10:7-18 (ESV)

- ⁷ So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep.
- ⁸ All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.
- ⁹ I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture.
- ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.
- ¹¹ I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.
- ¹² He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them.
- ¹³ He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.
- ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me,
- ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep.
- ¹⁶ And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.
- ¹⁷ For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again.
- ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."



Why Attend Vacation Bible School?



VBS stands for Vacation Bible School, and it is a summer church outreach focused on giving kids a fun and creative place to learn about the Bible and to build relationships with other kids and churches in the area. VBS offers the church fun and creative methods of teaching kids and youth Christ-like values and

relationship-building skills. It is an excellent outreach tool into the community—a way to invite those who do not normally attend to come into the church, get involved, and build relationships with others and with Jesus Christ. Churches generally run VBS for a week, and each program has its own theme (medieval castles, water parks, the Old West, etc., for example) that children can explore. A week of VBS usually includes games, snacks, crafts, skits, and, of course, Bible lessons! There is always a connection between God and the theme, allowing kids to discover God in a creative way and it offers a variety of ways for the entire congregation to become involved.
