Dear UMCSO Family,

I love November; I love the sights and smells of this time of year. Thanksgiving in particular has a special place in my heart. Growing up, Thanksgiving Day would begin with a trip to church. Our church had a special 8:30 am Service of Thanks. It was a moving service where people would give testimonies about how thankful they were to God for blessings and mercy received over the year. Our family would then travel by car from Connecticut over the Tappan Zee Bridge on to Montclair New Jersey, where my grandmother would provide a veritable feast for not only all of our relatives, but anyone who happened to drop by or who needed a meal. She was born in North Carolina and along with that came a southern tradition and feast. This feast included Turkey, Ham and usually another meat occasion something exotic like Possum (that someone brought), sweet potato casserole, at least two kinds of "greens," homemade cranberry sauce, breads, nuts, stuffing, potato salad, pies and always a coconut cake. There was more too. And, while I remember the food, it was the love of God and thankfulness that took place in my heart. Over the years I have been blessed by the love of kindhearted souls who took me in while I was in college in Wisconsin where I shared Thanksgiving with them. I also invited people to our home while in Seminary because Yale was so close to my home in Fairfield, CT. For the three years I was there a half a dozen friends would join us at the Thanksgiving table.

As I have grown older, I have continued the tradition. While living upstate, we opened our home to all who needed a place to spend the Holiday. Typically, we had between 21 -27 at the meal. I replicated my grandmother's and mom's Holiday traditions and menu, and even included something like Wild Boar or Venison. As I think of Thanksgiving I do so with a grateful heart because of what God continues to do for me.

It is all about God, really, and giving back at least a portion of what God his given to us. In absolutely everything, give thanks to God. First, because we owe him thanks for all he's given us, and second, because an attitude of gratitude is the best medicine for the damaging and destructive emotions in the stressful lives we live today. The secret of thankfulness is that it changes us. It lifts our spirits and is a tool to get us through when times are difficult. A thankful heart enjoys a blessing many times. Psychologists tell us that an "attitude of gratitude" is the single healthiest attitude we can have in all of life. The attitude of thankfulness produces more positive emotional energy than any other. Gratitude is the antidote for all those negative emotions and negative experiences in our lives.

Our God is a faithful God!! Let us be truly thankful.
